Census records indicate that, for these soldiers in particular, the ages listed below correspond with the year that they *first* entered the army, as opposed to the year that they were transferred to the 2nd Missouri Light Artillery (enlistment dates on this muster roll are for enlistment in the 2nd Missouri Light Artillery).

³The dates indicated on this chart are for e in the 2nd Missouri Light Artillery, as opposed to general enlistment.

⁴Information provided inside these brackets denotes a soldier's initial rank in the 2nd Missouri Light Artillery, followed by promotions, if any, and/or his rank upon leaving its service. Promotions and demotions are thus, denoted. Information was derived from the CWSS website, the Military Service Records, Bevier's List of Survivors, King's Historic Roll, and the 1881 History of Lafayette County. Discrepancies are indicated, but the higher rank is generally accepted as accurate. Ranks which are probable, but not confirmed, are indicated by a question mark.

However, his first name and middle initial are consistent throughout, and he is undoubtedly the same individual. The dates of enlistment are likely accounted for by the fact that the Missouri State Guard was absorbed by the C.S.A. - thus he enlisted twice, first on December 7, 1861 in the Missouri State Guard, and later, on December 20, 1861 (These were the two dates provided in the MSR records).

¹²The CWSS record lists his rank as Corp. → Sgt. The two MSR records both list it as Sergt. → Sergt. However, his desertion makes it very likely that he was later demoted to private.

Members of both were merged with the 2nd Missouri Light Artillery, the former in the autumn of 1863 and the latter in December of the same year. Tucker’s battery had 20 members.
