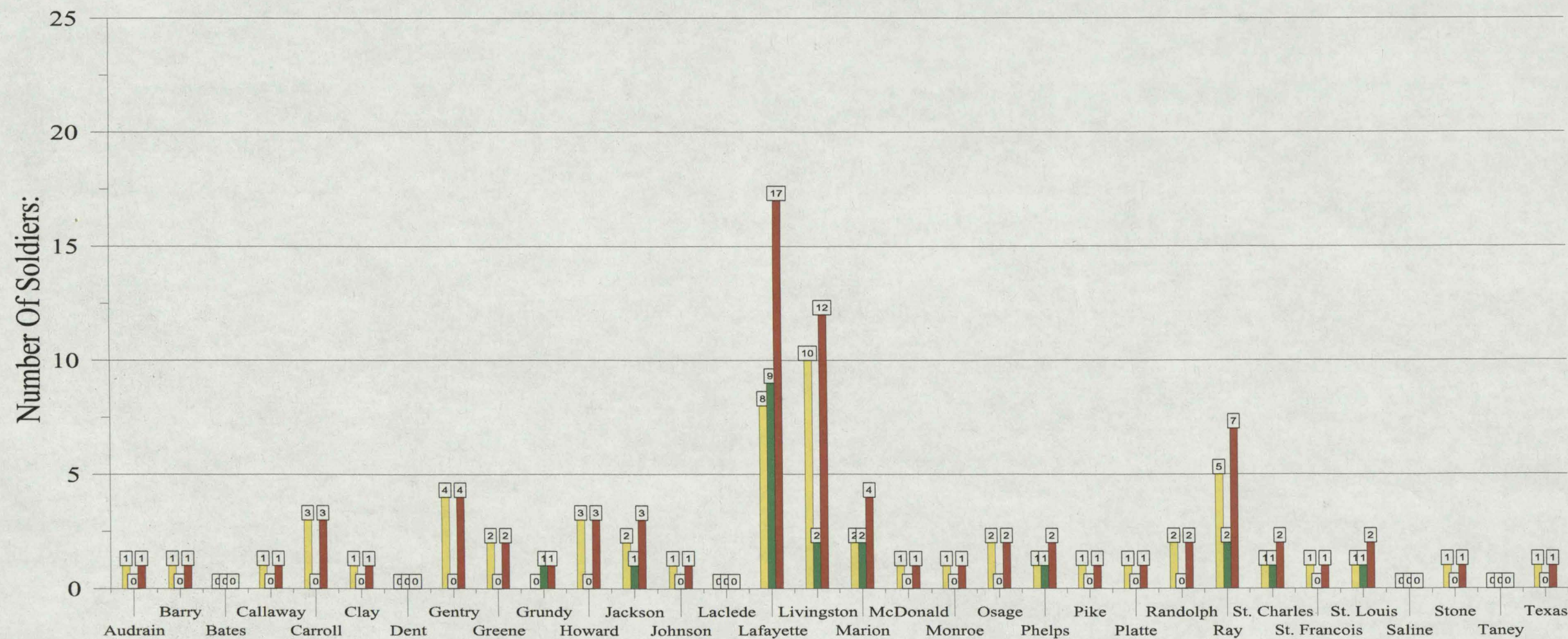

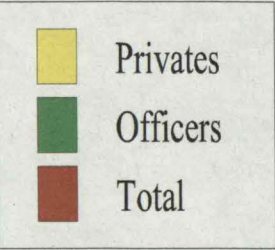


Occupations Of Soldiers In The 2nd Missouri Light Artillery:



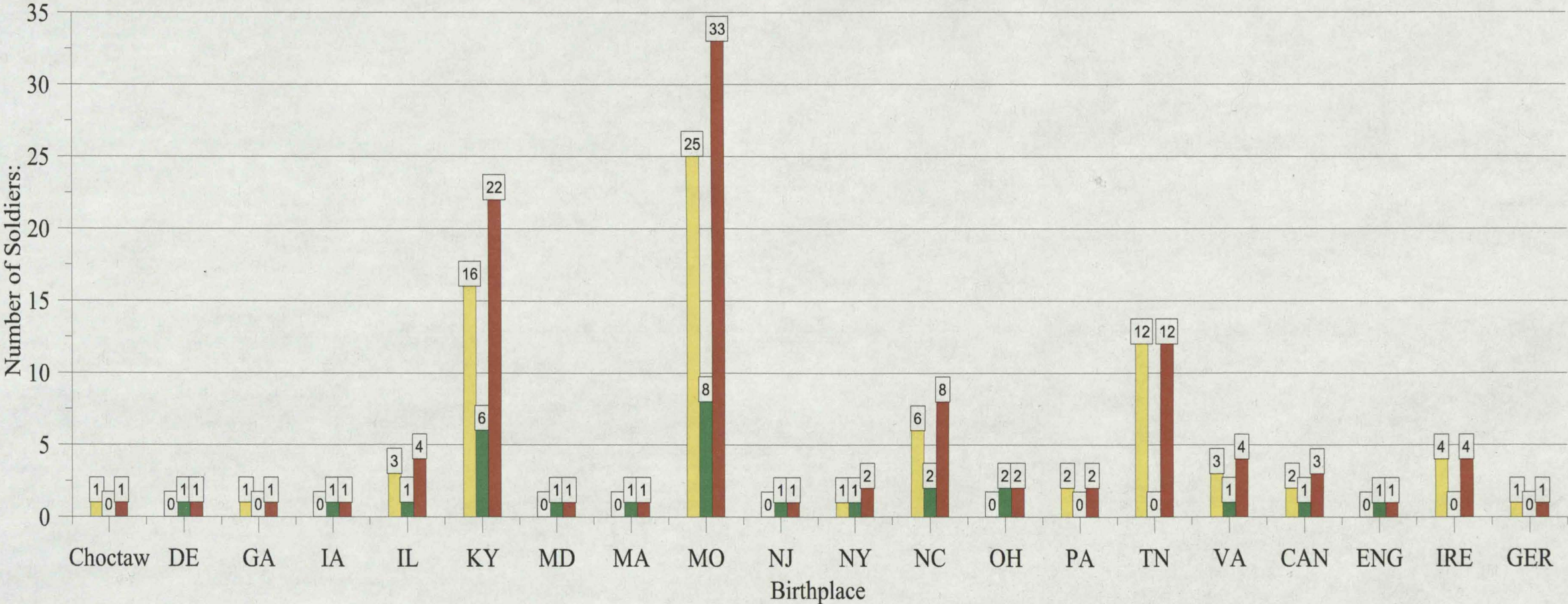

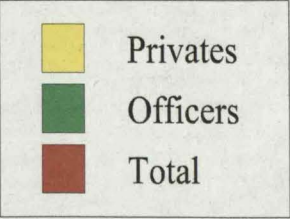




Nativity of Soldiers In The 2nd Missouri Light Artillery:

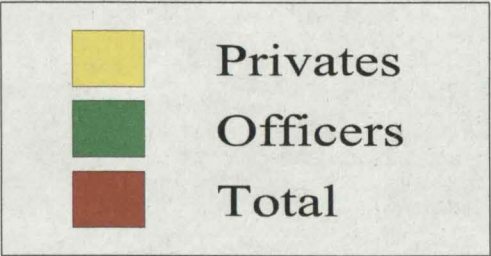

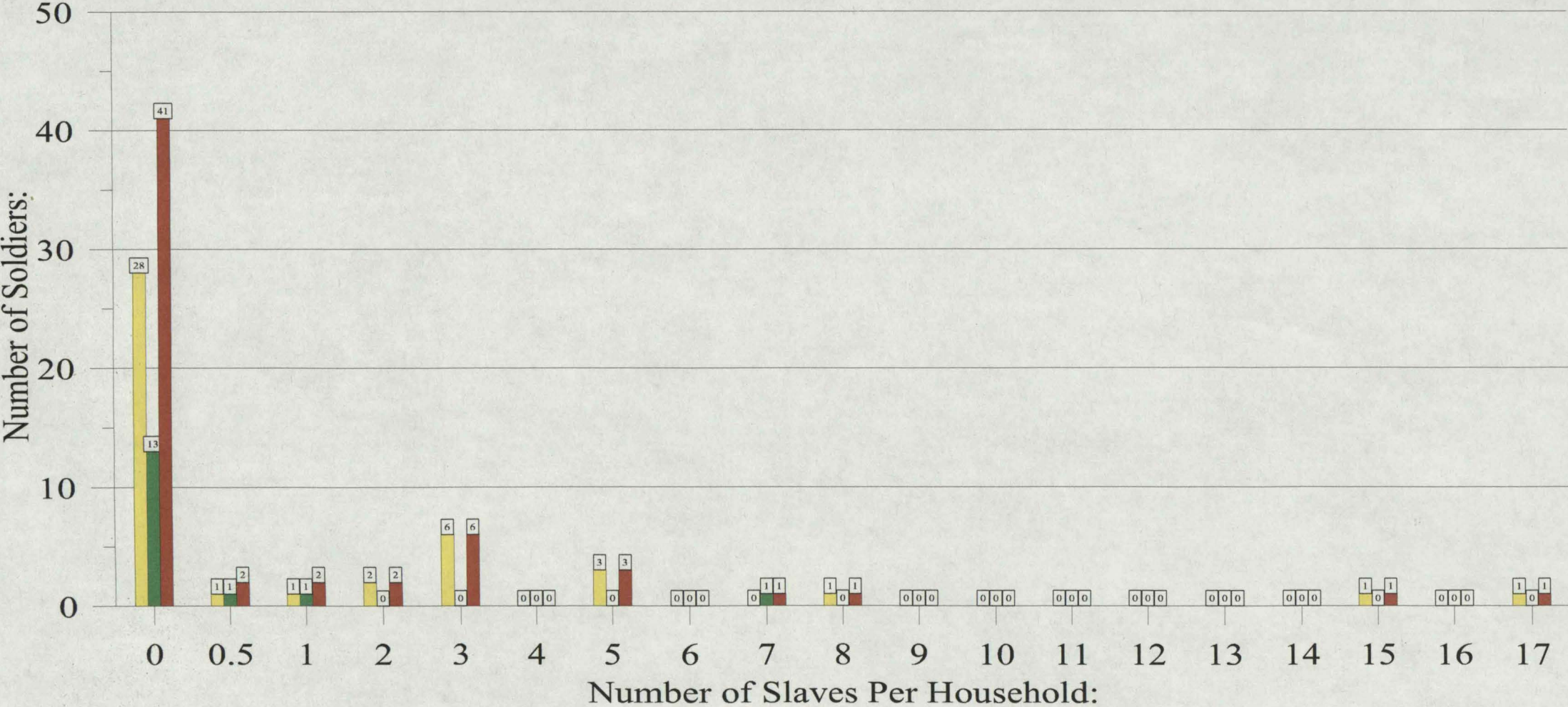

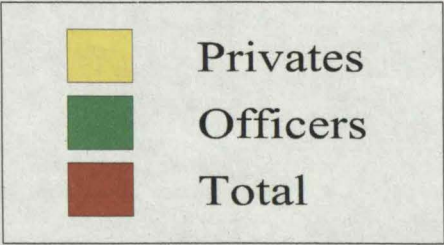




Number of Slaves Per Household In The 2nd Missouri Light Artillery:

When two soldiers/brothers share a single household, the total wealth and total number of slaves possessed by the head of the household has been divided equally between the sons, for the purpose of statistical calculations. In cases where the census only provided the income of the head of the household, but where familial connections are not apparent, soldiers have been assigned values of zero for both personal and real estate and for the number of slaves owned. Occupations for the head of household were noted in instances where the soldier did not have an occupation listed. However, this was done purely for the sake of interest, as the jobs were not assigned to the soldiers, for statistical purposes.
